DONABATE PARISH COUNCIL.

Proposed Schemes.

1. Medical Officer and Nurse for Donabate Parish.
2. Central Cemetery for the whole parish under the Board of Health.
3. Public conveniences and gutters Tower Bay, Brook, Corralles and Donabate.
4. Widening Back Road from Parnane Front Gate to Lydhers, and putting drains on each side of road.
5. Widening Donabate Bridge.
6. Electric light for Bawn, various cottages.
7. Dispensary, Hall, Library, and Vocational School required.
8. Bad gutters to be repaired.
9. Removing dangerous corners along the Detonale and Parnane road.

10. Housing.
11. Clearing of old unsightly ruins with no historic value.
12. Footpaths to be repaired.
13. Putting a jetty on pier of Tower Bay.
14. Trees to be planted along
15. ~~narrow passage to~~ ^{improve} ~~road~~ ^{neighbourhood} by proper houses with a view to doing some proper and essential Town Planning. Time has come when the planning of a model village for the parish is necessary. Hall, Dispensary, Library, and Vocational School to be put in the centre of the village.
16. Repairing Landowners' Cottages. Present planning of them should be changed, as they all look too similar.
17. Improving the appearance of the Square by having a proper Green laid down with seats around. Seats to be put here and there in village where desire for same would be most apparent.
18. The appointment of a whole time scavenger to take away all refuse from the houses.

19. Water and sanitation generally required.
20. Proper drainage of the Ballynadrugh, Lashington and Kilkea land.
21. Bad corners on Burtow Road, Cartrane, to be removed.
22. Public Park for parish.
23. Historic ruins to be preserved.
24. Special educational lectures on gardening agriculture to be held periodically.
25. Special steps to be taken locally with a view to making arrangements for the establishment of some local industry.
26. Proper fire-fighting appliances to be installed in centre of village.
27. Passage leading from Mr. H. Collins' house to sea to be graded a road and put in proper repair. There are several houses using the 132^{ft} as a water and fuel to the water. Local farmers are using the bye road also, drawing scowled.
28. The Chairman and Secretary printed the above schemes with the County Commissioner.
